

Student-Right-to-Know Act Graduation Rate Report Holy Family University - 2019 -

In accordance with the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, Holy Family University is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our Fall 2012 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduates.

As reported in the IPEDS graduation rates survey (GRS), during the Fall 2012 semester, 308 first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students entered Holy Family University. Sixty percent of these students had graduated from Holy Family University within 150% of the normal time to complete their degree (as of August 31, 2018). While reviewing this information, please keep the following in mind:

- All graduation rates are based on up to six years of attendance for bachelor’s programs, which equates to 150% of the normal completion time.
- We have elected not to report transfer-out rates because our College's mission does not include providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible institution without completing or graduating.
- These charts do not identify the reasons why our students withdrew; therefore, students who withdrew for personal or medical reasons are included.
- Graduation rates do not include students who left school to serve in the U.S. Armed Forces, on official church missions, or with a foreign aid service of the federal government, or students who died or were totally and permanently disabled.
