

Immediate Future Plans of Graduating Seniors (2025-2026)

Holy Family University's Office of Institutional Effectiveness*

Results are based on respondents to Holy Family University's Senior Exit Survey for the 2025-2026 academic year. The Senior Exit Survey was administered during the Spring 2026 semester to those traditional¹ Holy Family University undergraduate students who were graduating in May 2026. In total, 299 pending graduates received an invitation to the Senior Exit Survey. The following tables are based on the 112 completed surveys received from this population.²

Activities Post-Graduation

Percentage of respondents who selected from the list below their most likely activities after graduation:

Paid employment, full-time (30+ hours/week):	64.8%
Paid employment, part-time (less than 30 hours/week):	17.6%
Graduate or professional school, full-time:	21.2%
Graduate or professional school, part-time:	10.2%
Seeking employment/internship:	47.2%
Travel:	13.9%
Military Service:	1.9%
Other:	10.2%

¹By "traditional" undergraduates, this includes all undergraduates who enrolled at HFU either as a first-time, first-year student or a transfer student. It precludes those undergraduate students enrolled at HFU for a second degree (e.g., HFU's Second Degree Bachelor of Nursing Daytime 14-Month program.)

²This constitutes a 37.5% completion rate to the Senior Exit Survey.

Percentage of respondents who indicated their likelihood to pursue additional degrees in the future:

Master’s Level Program (M.A., M.S., M.Ed, etc.):	66.3%
Professional Practice (PA, PT, MSN):	13.7%
Law School:	4.2%
Medical School:	3.2%
A terminal degree (e.g. Ph.D, EdD, DNP, etc.):	11.6%
No other degrees:	17.9%
