

Annual Campus Security Report

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act or Clery Act is a federal statute codified at 20 U.S.C. § 1092(f). The Clery Act requires all public and private postsecondary institutions participating in HEA's Title IV student financial assistance programs to disclose campus crime statistics and security information. The Act is enforced by the United States Department of Education.

The Clery Act requires that schools:

- Publish an annual report every year by October 1st that contains three years of campus crime statistics and certain campus security policy statements.
- Publish crime statistics for the campus, public areas immediately adjacent to or running through the campus, and certain non-campus facilities and remote classrooms. (The statistics must be gathered from campus police or security, local law enforcement, and other University officials who have “significant responsibility for student and campus activities.”)

The Clery Act requires Holy Family University to disclose three general categories of crime statistics, some with significant subcategories and conditions:

1. Criminal Offenses.
2. Hate Crimes—Any of the above-mentioned offenses, and any incidents of Larceny-Theft, Simple Assault, Intimidation, or Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property that were motivated by bias.
3. Arrests and Referrals for Disciplinary Action for Weapons: Carrying, Possessing, Etc., Drug Abuse Violations and Liquor Law Violations.

The Act also requires Holy Family University to publish “timely warning” notices where a crime has occurred on or near campus that, in the judgment of the Department of Public Safety, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat to members of the University community. Lastly, the Act makes available for public inspection a daily public crime log of “any crime that occurred on campus [...] or within the patrol jurisdiction of the campus Public Safety [...] and is reported to campus Public Safety.”

Holy Family University's 2021 Annual Security Report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by Holy Family University; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning sexual assault, other matters, and also the University's Annual Fire Safety Report.
