Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

Designed for graduates of accredited BSN programs and experienced nurses seeking additional education in nursing. Our Rapid Degree MSN program allows you to complete a 30-credit (10 courses) MSN in advanced nursing with a focus on quality, safety, and leadership. This program is designed in accord with the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) MSN Essentials of Master's Education in Nursing (2011) to prepare nurse leaders in a variety of nursing specialties.

Academic Program

Advance your skills through a variety of experiential and clinical activities. Graduates of the MSN program are prepared to progress to advanced practice programs at the doctoral level e.g., DNP/Nurse Practitioner programs, PhD programs, EdD programs, or to post-master's certificate programs.

Courses are held once a week in an eight-week format that blends face-to-face evening meetings with online learning.

- On-site cohorts are held in the evenings at Main Campus, 9801 Frankford Avenue, Philadelphia PA 19114.
- Off-site cohort opportunities are available at your work location with discounted tuition. A cohort is a tight-knit learning community of students, usually 15-20, enrolled throughout their entire academic program.

Admission Requirements – Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

You must possess the following qualifications for admission to the MSN program.

 A BSN from an NLNAC-, ACEN-, CNEA-, or CCNE-accredited nursing program at a regionally accredited institution;

or

- An RN from an NLNAC-, ACEN-, CNEA-accredited program with a BS or BA in a related area may be admitted, but must meet BSN equivalent competencies* in nursing leadership, research, and community health as prerequisites to certain courses.
- Completion of an undergraduate statistics course with a grade of C or better (must be completed prior to enrolling in graduate research courses).
- An undergraduate grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.
 Applicants with a GPA below 3.0 may be admitted on a probationary basis.
 Students admitted on probation will be considered for full admission after satisfactory completion of six credits of graduate coursework with a grade of B in each course.
- Two professional references (former faculty member, an employer or supervisor, or a professional colleague).
- · Licensure as a registered nurse in the US.
- · Application and application fee. (Fee is waived for alumni.)
- · Official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended.
- A 250 to 500-word personal statement concerning the student's interest and reason for applying.
- · Professional résumé.

*BSN Equivalent Competencies

Students admitted without BSN degrees must complete the BSN equivalent competencies as prerequisites to specific courses:

- Research prior to enrolling in NURS 608
- Leadership prior to enrolling in NURS 614
- Community health prior to enrolling in NURS 607
